Introductory Letter to Parents

The following letter will be given to the families of all students in order to inform them about the Family Education Workshop for the Algebra 1 class that will be taken place at the beginning of the school year. The purpose of the workshop is to increase family engagement and involvement. I will also have physical copies of the letter available at the entrance of the school and will also be sending it to the families via email.

Hello, Families!

My name is Margarita Fox, your child's Algebra 1 teacher for this school year. I am writing to inform you about the new Family Engagement Workshop sessions coming up, specially designed to help you and your student(s) feel supported and involved while taking this Algebra 1 class. The purpose of these workshop sessions is to provide you with information about the topics the course will cover and show you what class projects will entail. This workshop will give you resources to use at home and the strategies you can use to help your student finish this class successfully. We will also go over the School Progress Report Data System. One of the sessions will cover how to use the Reporting System and how to check your student's daily reports and communicate directly with their teachers.

My main goal is that after completing this workshop, you will feel confident, wellequipped, and motivated to support your student at home and be involved in their education.

This Family Engagement Program includes four sessions, and I hope to see you participate in all of them! We will have fun giveaways every session and a big raffle and a party in the last session. We will be meeting for the first time on Tuesday, September 15th, at 7:00

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PM. After that, we will meet on Tuesdays every two weeks, with the last session being on October 27th, where we will celebrate the end of the program and all of our accomplishments.

Please find below the titles, dates, and times of all four sessions.

- ✓ Session 1: "How to support your student at home." During this session, I will briefly go over the course content and present ideas to increase communication and help you engage and motivate your student at home, including online resources, games, and fun activities. I will go over a PowerPoint presentation that details how to access the School's Data Report System and explain the benefits of checking it regularly. We will also discuss how the material learned in this class can serve as a base for their upcoming secondary math classes. Parents will have the chance to ask questions in person, or if they prefer to have written communication, they can submit ticket questions in their preferred language. There will be flyers summarizing the topics covered and copies of the presentation available in other languages. This session will take place in the student lounge, on September 15th at 6:30 PM.
- Session 2: "Performance tasks and Chapter Tests: What you need to know." In this session, I will explain briefly what performance tasks are and what is expected from the students. I will also include ideas on ways you can help and support your student at home, as well as ways to identify and reduce stress and math anxiety. We will discuss the class calendar and schedule so parents can have a better idea about when these assignments, projects, and tests will be taking place. We will also dedicate the last fifteen minutes of this session to answering questions parents might have. There will be flyers summarizing the topics covered and copies of the presentation available in other

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languages. This session will take place in the student lounge, on <u>September 29th at 6:30</u> PM.

- ✓ Session 3: "Course Pacing and Avoiding Procrastination." During this session, I will provide a list of available resources and provide ideas on how parents can help their students organize their time and tackle procrastination effectively. At the end of the session, I will be available for one-on-one communication and to answer questions. There will be flyers summarizing the topics covered and copies of the presentation available in other languages. This session will take place in the student lounge, on October 13th at 6:30 PM.
- ✓ Session 4: "End of the Program Celebration." Before ending the program with dinner and games, we will sit in a round table to share experiences, strategies that worked and were successful with the students, and recommendations for future workshops. After that, we will enjoy a delicious dinner and play trivia to test what we learned in the sessions. Families who are present will be able to participate in the raffle to win prizes such as gift cards or a dinner delivery service for a week. There will be flyers summarizing the topics covered and copies of the presentation available in other languages. This session will take place in the student lounge, on October 27th at 6:30 PM.
